What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the following information to provide services and goods, including delivery and third party referrals:

- Names and contact details

We collect or use the following information to receive donations or funding and organise fundraising activities:

- Names and contact details
- Donation and funding history

We collect or use the following personal information for service updates or marketing purposes:

- Names and contact details
- Marketing preferences
- Donation and funding history

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a “lawful basis” for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO’s website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are in brief set out below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO’s website:

- Your right of access - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for.
- Your right to rectification - You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete.
- Your right to erasure - You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information.
- Your right to restriction of processing - You have the right to ask us to limit how we can use your personal information.
- Your right to object to processing - You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data.
- Your right to data portability - You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you.
- Your right to withdraw consent – When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.

If you make a request, we must respond to you without undue delay and in any event within one month.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data

Where we get personal information from

- Directly from you
- Your current employer (if they are a subscribing corporate member of The Engineers Reuse Collective CIC)

How long we keep information

We retain information for a period of 6 years after your last contact with us.

Who we share information with

We will never share personal information with a third party for the purposes of marketing unless given prior consent.

We do share personal information with some third parties in the process of providing our services, for instance with IT and software providers. By submitting personal data to us, you are agreeing to its processing by these parties. However steps will be taken by The Engineers Reuse Collective CIC to ensure that the same standards of privacy are adhered to, equal to those outlined in this document.

The Engineers Reuse Collective CIC may share your data with the following data processors: Eventbrite, Mailchimp, Stripe, Wix.com, and Zoho Books.

Sharing information outside the UK

Where necessary, our data processors may share personal information outside of the UK. When doing so, they comply with the UK GDPR, making sure appropriate safeguards are in place.
